
GOOD FRIDAY...APRIL 3






Youth Breakfast



Why Is It Important to Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle?

Reduction, Recycling and Reusing save natural resources, reduce damage to the environment and save money. Reduction means using as little of substance as necessary. For instance think about the packaging that

comes on most children's toys and electronics. By ordering online (such as through Amazon) you can select the environmentally friendly packaging alternative. This reduces the amount of plastic (which is always difficult to remove) and substitutes a recyclable package (such as cardboard). Recycling takes an object that has served its initial usefulness and puts it to use in another manner. It saves energy and by saving energy reduces global climate change by the mere reduction of fossil fuel use. It reduces waste in landfills and therefore extends their useful life span. It saves money. In part by saving energy there is an obvious reduction in production costs plus the transportation costs of raw material to the factory is eliminated. The third component of this environmental wheel is reusing. Taking out grown clothes to the Clothing Closet or using them for the next child are perfect examples of reusing. Buying reusable plastic bottles for water is also an excellent example. As Christians we can protect the environment and save money by considering the reduce, reuse, and recycle wheel.




