# Lent 2021 Theme: Community

Throughout Scripture, the importance of community is emphasized time and time again. From the gathering of Israelites that wandered in the wilderness, to the people forced into exile, to the disciples gathered around Jesus, and the Spirit-inspired early church, community is how God's love and presence are expressed.

A year of abnormal life and church practices due to COVID-19 has revealed the importance of community. Unable to gather in the same space together as one community, we have found new and different ways to be community. We will spend this Lenten season exploring the importance of community, and why God chooses to work through community.

#### **Lent Opportunities**

#### Daily Scripture

During the season of Lent, you are invited to participate in a practice of daily Scripture readings. As a congregation, we will be reading through the Gospel of Mark. Each day, there will be a short reading assigned for you to participate in this intentional practice.

#### Community Art

There will be opportunities throughout the season for you to participate in an art project at the church. You will be able to contribute pieces to the project in a safe and socially distanced way. Please keep your eyes open for more details.

#### Wednesday Dinner and Gathering

On Wednesday evenings, you are invited to come by the church to pick up a simple meal. After sharing your meal together at home, you can log on to a weekly Zoom call at 7:00 p.m. There will be dedicated time for you to catch up with your FPC friends and family, and we will close each week with a time of worship and music together. Please keep your eyes open for details on how to participate in these weekly gatherings.


#### Prayer Vigil

As part of our Lenten practice this year, the church will host a 24-hour prayer vigil. We will begin praying as a community at 12:00 p.m. on Saturday, March 20 and conclude with corporate prayer in worship on March 21. You can sign-up to participate in as much time as you would like for this prayer vigil. There will be an online sign-up form once the time gets closer. Unlike our prayer vigil last year, this one will take place from our homes. When you sign-up, you will receive resources and instructions to help guide your prayer. #### **NEWS FROM MWANDI**

Mwandi United Church of Zambia (UCZ) Hospital has been designated as an official Area Covid-19 Treatment Center for Zambia and has refurbished a portion of the TB Ward into a Covid ward. Limited sources of PPE and oxygen have hampered treatment. With limited PPE, this has lead to the hospital staff being hard hit by Covid. Zambia is currently experiencing a spike with the virulent South Africa strain. It is interesting to note that it is mandatory to wear a mask in Zambia.

Keith and Ida Waddell will soon be leaving their current positions as UCZ Education and Health Secretaries and returning to Mwandi as Mission Support for Health and Special Needs at Mwandi. The Mwandi community will greatly benefit from the Waddell's return. Special Needs is an area of concern that is not often addressed in 3<sup>rd</sup> world countries. Physical and mental issues carry a stigma that results in persons being concealed within the home. The Waddell's adopted son, Mubita, is on the autism spectrum and has benefited greatly from Keith's background in education. Keith and Ida will bring a much needed service to southwestern Zambia.





## PFEIFFER FRIENDS

Last fall, the Health Sciences Program of Pfeiffer University opened its doors in downtown Albemarle. As of the January enrollment, there are approximately 90 students from across the United States and the world who are working on a degree in the Physician's Assistant or Occupational Therapy Programs. Many of these students are a long way from home and they have taken a leap of faith to be in this program.

Several downtown churches, including First Presbyterian Church, are moving forward with a partnership with these students similar to our Silent Partner program. There are two main differences: the relationship will last about 27 months (the length of each program) and the Pfeiffer student will know who their friend is. We hope that there will be communication at least once a month between the friend and the student.

We will match a member of one of our churches with a Pfeiffer student. The student understands that this relationship is not a "pull into church" but rather a friendly connection with someone in the community. To support these hard-working students, the community member will send notes of encouragement, gift cards, gift boxes, or anything to support them. For your convenience, these items can be dropped off at the Pfeiffer campus in downtown Albemarle or mailed directly to your student.






## Education and Conversation Tuesday, February 23 at 7:00 p.m.

kingdom-oriented world in which, we are all one in Christ (Galatians 3:28).


