

Lent Opportunities

Daily Scripture

During the season of Lent, you are invited to participate in a practice of daily Scripture readings. As a congregation, we will be reading through the Gospel of Mark. Each day, there will be a short reading assigned for you to participate in this intentional practice.

Community Art

Beginning on the third Sunday of Lent (March 7), there will be a cross placed on the First Street lawn of the church. You are invited to come anytime to attach something to the cross which reminds you of our community. It can be an item you already have or an item you decorate. There will be templates available at the cross or for delivery (upon request) for you to take home, decorate, and bring back. Take a picture of yourself hanging your contribution on the cross and come check out the final project on Easter Sunday. More details and instructions will be available at the art location.

Wednesday Dinner and Gathering

On Wednesday evenings, you are invited to come by the church to pick up a simple meal. After sharing your meal together at home, you can log on to a weekly Zoom call at 7:00 p.m. There will be dedicated time for you to catch up with your FPC friends and family, and we will close each week with a time of worship and music together. Please keep your eyes open for details on how to participate in these weekly gatherings.

Prayer Vigil

As part of our Lenten practice this year, the church will host a 24-hour prayer vigil. We will begin praying as a community at 12:00 p.m. on Saturday, March 20 and conclude with corporate prayer in worship on March 21. You can sign-up to participate in as much time as you would like for this prayer vigil. There will be an online sign-up form once the time gets closer. Unlike our prayer vigil last year, this one will take place from our homes. When you sign-up, you will receive resources and instructions to help guide your prayer. There will also be a live-stream of the church sanctuary with contemplative music to help focus your prayer time.







Education and Conversation Tuesday, March 23 at 7:00 p.m.


Our congregation, along with many others, is continuing a challenging journey of educating ourselves about race in America. Members of the church have been gathering on Zoom to explore how we benefit from or are affected by systems of privilege, and how we might bring about a kingdom-oriented world in which, we are all one in Christ (Galatians 3:28).


Bible Study and Conversation
