
From Where I Sit

Dear Friends.

I'm a news junky. But lately, with the constant, awful news out of Ukraine, I'll switch to reruns of Friends or Modern Family. In recent months, my mother has died, as has the husband of a dear friend, and we all know and love people who are dealing with health issues and personal issues and so forth and so on. There's just too much and it's just not fair. Life is not fair. Life is never fair.

In chapter 13 of Luke, Jesus is told about the killing of some Galileans in the temple by Pilate. They were raising the oldest of religious questions: How is it that the more or less righteous suffer while those who are clearly evil often seem to win? Instead of great sympathy from Jesus in the face of this tragedy, he gives a direct rebuttal to any who would claim that there's a simple correlation between human goodness and human suffering. Life is not fair. Life is never fair.

And Jesus seems to know this about life and to accept life for what it is. He's saying that suffering and death will come to all of us sooner or later in one form




In his book, A Grace Disguised, Gerald Sittser writes of his profound loss. In a single car accident, he lost his mother, his wife, and his 14 year old daughter. He said that many people consoled him with word about the unfairness of it all and that at first, those words gave him comfort. But then he writes: Over time, I began to be bothered by the assumption that I had a right to complete fairness. Granted, I did not deserve to lose three members of my family. But then, I'm not sure I deserved to have them in the first place. Perhaps I did not deserve their deaths; but I didn't deserve their presence in my life, either. On the face of it, living in a perfectly fair world appeals to me. But deeper reflection makes me wonder. In such a world, I might never experience tragedy, but neither would I experience grace, especially the grace God gave me in the form of three people whom I lost."

So, I think I'm asking God to spare us a lifetime of fairness. To live in a world with grace is better by far than to live in a world of absolute fairness. A fair world might make life nice for us, but only as nice as we are. We might get what we deserve, but I wonder how much that is and whether or not we'd really be satisfied. A world with grace will give us more than we deserve. It will give us life, even in our suffering.

Life is not fair. Life is never fair. Yet....despite all of our losses, in spite of all of our suffering, all of us get far more than we can ever earn, far more than we can ever deserve in this life. Life is not fair. Life is never fair. Thanks be to God for that. Thanks be to God for grace. And that's the view from where I sit.

And that's very good news from where I sit.



# IMPORTANT COVID UPDATED INFORMATION UPDATED ON DECEMBER 8, 2021

For the health and welfare of our members and our community, the COVID Task Force Committee has set the following guidelines with the following updates:

# FROM THE COVID TASK FORCE (FEBRUARY 28, 2022)...

- 1. With improving community COVID positivity rate, masks will be OPTIONAL beginning February 27.

- 4. Congregational meals will remain on hold until positivity rate remains consistently below 8% for 2 weeks. The COVID Task Force will continue to monitor community positivity rate and adjust recommendations as needed.

- ❖ Hand sanitizer is available. Please use it.
- ❖ If you are sick, please stay at home.
- Communion will be given with prepackaged elements.
- ❖ All volunteers and paid employees involved in any children's program(s) are required to be vaccinated.
- All toys, chairs, tables and bathrooms, (used that day) are to be wiped clean with a Clorox wipe or sprayed and wiped clean.
- First Family meals will be drive-thru.
- All surfaces (chairs and tables and bathrooms if used) have to be wiped clean (with spray or wipes) after any committee/group meets.






# April Book Conversation Monday, April 25 at 7:00 p.m. in the Parlor

The May book is *The Girls in the Stilt House* by Kelly Mustian. We will meet in the parlor at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, May 23.

Set in 1920s Mississippi, this debut Southern novel weaves a beautiful and harrowing story of two teenage girls cast in an unlikely partnership through murder—perfect for readers of *Where the Crawdads Sing* and *If the Creek Don't Rise*. Ada promised herself she would never go back to the Trace, to her hard life on the swamp and her harsh father. But now, after running away to Baton Rouge and briefly knowing a different kind of life, she finds herself with nowhere to go but back home. And, she knows there will be

a price to pay with her father. Matilda, daughter of a sharecropper, is from the other side of the Trace. Doing what she can to protect her family from the whims and demands of some particularly callous locals is an ongoing struggle. She forms a plan to go north, to pack up the secrets she's holding about her life in the South and hang them on the line for all to see in Ohio. As the two girls are drawn deeper into a dangerous world of bootleggers and moral corruption, they must come to terms with the complexities of their tenuous bond and a hidden past that links them in ways that could cost them their lives.






