From Where I Sit

Dear Friends,

Remember the old ad, ...inquiring minds want to know? Anyway, I wanted to share some information with those of you who want to know about the Mission Study process this congregation is about to enter. A Mission Study is a process that a congregation goes through to seek discernment about how God would have that church to be and to act in the future. It's led by a team appointed by the Session and will be referred to as the Mission Study Team (MST). This team is being formed. The process results in a report that will be presented to the Session for approval and to the Committee on Ministry for review. This review is a necessary step before a congregation can begin the search for the next installed pastor.

There are several reasons for a Mission Study. As a church, we always seek to examine ourselves and our actions in the light of scripture and prayerfully to ask God's guidance as we try to determine the work God wants us to do in a certain time and place. Secondly, unlike most corporations, the church is a *volunteer* organization. The corporate model in which leadership sets direction and tells staff to follow it does not work well in a church. It's important to involve as much of the congregation as possible in the process of self-examination and decision-making. There are two reasons for this. One is that as Reformed Christians we believe both in the priesthood of believers and in the corporate body of the church — that together we are richer and wiser than we are separately. The second helps to develop a sense of ownership within the congregation of the new directions for the ministry of that church in the coming years.

A Mission Study does fact-finding about this congregation and the community in which it ministers. It will provide an opportunity for members of the congregation to prayerfully study what scripture says about the church, to learn new information about the community and its needs, to learn who you have been and who you are as a congregation, and to celebrate the gifts as a church. Once this period of learning is complete, then the congregation has the information it needs to begin to design its vision and develop new goals and objectives for its ministry in the coming years. As one presbytery leader put it when explaining the idea of a mission study to a congregation, It boils down to a church looking out the window (What's our mission field?) and in the mirror (Who are we and what gifts have God given us for this time and place?).

Information will be coming as to what your role will be in this process. In the meantime, continue to pray for your Session, the Mission Study Team, your Transitional Pastor, and all members of this congregation as we continue in our ministry to our Lord in this place. The newly appointed Mission Study Team members are: Bill Jolly, Kim Marshall, Catherine Moeller, Sandy Rogers, and Ellen Whitley. And that's the view from where I sit....

IMPORTANT COVID UPDATED INFORMATION UPDATED ON DECEMBER 8, 2021

FROM THE COVID TASK FORCE (FEBRUARY 28, 2022)...

- All toys, chairs, tables and bathrooms, (used that day) are to be wiped clean with a Clorox wipe or sprayed and wiped clean.
- First Family meals will be drive-thru.
- All surfaces (chairs and tables and bathrooms if used) have to be wiped clean (with spray or wipes) after any committee/group meets.




May Book Conversation on Monday, May 23 at 7:00 p.m. in the Parlor

The May book is *The Girls in the Stilt House* by Kelly Mustian. We will meet in the parlor at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, May 23.

Set in 1920s Mississippi, this debut Southern novel weaves a beautiful and harrowing story of two teenage girls cast in an unlikely partnership through murder—perfect for readers of *Where the Crawdads Sing* and *If the Creek Don't Rise*. Ada promised herself she would never go back to the Trace, to her hard life on the swamp and her harsh father. But now, after running away to Baton Rouge and briefly knowing a different kind of life, she finds herself with nowhere to go but back home. And, she knows there will be a price to pay with her father. Matilda, daughter of a sharecropper, is from the other side of the Trace. Doing what she can to protect her family from the whims and demands of some particularly callous locals is an ongoing struggle.

She forms a plan to go north, to pack up the secrets she's holding about her life in the South and hang them on the line for all to see in Ohio. As the two girls are drawn deeper into a dangerous world of bootleggers and moral corruption, they must come to terms with the complexities of their tenuous bond and a hidden past that links them in ways that could cost them their lives.

The June book is *Conjure Women* by Atakora Afia. We will meet in the parlor at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, June 27.

Conjure Women is a sweeping story that brings the world of the South before and after the Civil War vividly to life. Spanning eras and generations, it tells of the lives of three unforgettable women: Miss May Belle, a wise healing woman; her precocious and observant daughter Rue, who is reluctant to follow in her mother's footsteps as a midwife; and their master's daughter Varina. The secrets and bonds among these women and their community come to a head at the beginning of a war and at the birth of an accursed child, who sets the townspeople alight with fear and a spreading superstition that threatens their newly won, tenuous freedom.

Magnificently written, brilliantly researched, richly imagined, *Conjure Women* moves back and forth in time to tell the haunting story of Rue, Varina, and May Belle, their passions and

friendships, and the lengths they will go to save themselves and those they love.




